The second half started well for Rangiora as the forwards controlled possession well and were dominating the set piece well at times. An early penalty (converted by Freeman Eder) took the score to 8-15 and soon after Nigel Gibb scored a second with a strong burst through a tiring Ashburton defence. The conversion from Eder levelled the score at 15 all. The game turned again with Ashburton finding another opening out wide to score and convert to retake the lead. Rangiora were



finishing the stronger of the two sides with fitness beginning to come through. A strong passage of play on attack and Nigel Gibb crashed over for his third try duly converted by Eder to level the scores at 22-22.

The game was there for the taking but from the kick-off a loose pass allowed the pacy Ashburton backs to swoop and score giving them another 7 point lead. With 10 minutes still to play the home side were chasing the game again. Patience and territory allowed pressure to build and hard working number 8 Daniel Mato barged over for a try. This was converted calmly by the reliable boot of Freeman Eder. 29-29. With 5 minutes to play Rangiora went on attack. Again they patiently built the phases and worked their way into Ashburton territory. The defence held and despite having several strong attacks foiled the clock ran down and the game finished a draw.


This is a great opportunity for Nigel, and we wish him all the best for his week.
