#### Press Cup Round 7: vs Waimea College at Waimea

The second half began well for Waimea as a well-placed up and under was gathered and a try scored to give them a 10-13 lead. The response from Rangiora was to control much of what remained of the game. Sparked into action by a fullback defensive error Lemuel Hill ignited the Rangiora charge with a spectacular 60 metre counter attack running through the Waimea team with ease. Brought down short of the line the attack was continued and a couple of quick carries saw number 8 Cam Dyer score the first of

his two tries for the game. The boot of Rhys Smith was proving very reliable and he duly slotted the conversion.



Waimea were forced to defend for large periods and they did Rangiora looked SO well. threatening and were rewarded with a well-constructed fast break try to Cam Dyer who was having one of his best games of the season. Despite continual attacking pressure the Waimea defence held strong to prevent Rangiora scoring a bonus point try despite coming agonisingly close on a number of occasions. A last play penalty kick to Rhys Smith finished the game.

Work rate and determination were evident as the side

maintained its focus throughout the game. The challenge now is to carry that standard through to the next game. It is a cliché but it doesn't get any easier as Rangiora hosts defending champions Marlborough Boys College.
