UC CHAMPIONSHIP ROUND NINE: 1st XV v RONCALLI COLLEGE

Although Roncalli College from Timaru had not recorded a win they too had a tough draw to start their UC Championship season, so Rangiora wisely was not taking this encounter lightly. The fact Rangiora had not beaten Roncalli also added motivation to the local side.

The game started well with the determined visitors tackling strongly but Rangiora sensibly controlled play. A slick back move from an attacking scrum saw wing, Jayden Pearce, with enough space to run around to score for Patrick McCallum to convert. Soon after Rangiora confidently turned down three points to attack the Roncalli try line again. However infringements meant their gamble backfired and play return to neutral territory.





The game was then marred by a scuffle between teams, and the disruption saw Rangiora lose its momentum and a poor defensive line allowed the Timaru side to score an unconverted try. The game continued to lose structure with errors, infringements and poor decision making.

McCallum had kicked a penalty goal before number 8, Harley Robinson, added some energy to the attack, and clever work by him on the blindside of a scrum gave Jordan Gray space to score untouched. Unfortunately soon after Robinson had to leave the field with a broken collarbone as the first half ended at 15-5 to the home team.

Stern words at half time had Rangiora starting the second half as they had the first. Another penalty goal extended their lead to 6 points. And when McCallum kicked his fourth goal of the day, Rangiora had a little breathing space.

Roncalli were not finished and their determination was fueled by their second try late in the game. However Rangiora lifted themselves to control the territory and the match to hold on to win 21-15.

Louis James, Oscar Howat and Naaria Wilson-Bairds continued their good form particularly at lineout time and in the tackle. Robinson had returned to his bullocking ways until his injury. Kerran Jenkins took the gaps well early on, and Rhys Smith was tidy both in attack and in cover defense.







Their dominance at the start of both halves was the difference for Rangiora in the end. It would have been much easier for supporters and coaches if they had maintained that structured attack throughout. So after their third win, Rangiora are now focusing their attention on the vastly improved Christ College team on Wednesday afternoon. It will take are more consistent performance to achieve back to back wins at their historical 'Upper' field.







